Preface

The following twelve interviews were deposed several days to several years after the final selection conducted by UNOHSP, the United Nations One Human Selection Process, and upon the ascension of the Chosen One, the Final Prophet, Our Savior, the Anointed One, the One Human, also known as Who B. Selrem, (the Human Being Selected to Represent Mankind), and finally, the man known as Esa. These selected interviews are from those who knew Him best, twelve of his friends from the UNOHSP training camp:

Xiao Niao (Little Bird), hero of the People's Republic of China;

Dr. Maurice L'ouverture, professor and dean of the Department of History and Transatlantic Slave Trade at the Université d'Etat d'Haiti in Port-au-Prince, Haiti.

Verdade, a Brazilian dockworker;

the Senegalese Griot; the Bedouin from Egypt's Sinai Peninsula; the Xhosan medical doctor from Capetown, South Africa; and a woman Mongolian sumo-wrestler.

This account is an attempt to accurately reconstruct the events spanning the thirty years from Earth's first encounter with the alien race, known as the Crætors, up to the moment of His departure from Earth aboard the alien spacecraft. Since his fate is still yet as undetermined, the overriding concern of the Board of Directors is to compile an unbiased depiction, free of secular slander and irreligious libel, of the Man in order to sanctify and honor his memory, for as long as we may last.
